Wellbeing at HFJNS

As part of the Wellbeing and SPHE curriculum, children are encouraged to identify and discuss their emotions. Interactive Zones of Regulation

Stations have been set up around the school. The children can visit these stations to reflect on their emotions. They look into a mirror and ask themselves "How Am I Feeling Today?" Depending on their mood/feeling, they then pop a coloured coded pompom into the relevant cup. They can reflect upon this and are supported in acquiring the skills to deal with and/or overcome their emotions. The First Class children are engaging with the "A Lust for Life" Programme at the moment. This programme builds resilience, increases

wellbeing and enhances the emotional literacy in children. We hope to continue the programme next year and possibly introduce into other streams as time goes on. The programme content is extremely relevant to Children's Wellbeing and Mental Health. The children are also exposed to lots of positive affirmations as they move around the school in the forms displays, posters and we are currently working on our Wellbeing Wall.

Irish Author, Aine Murray kindly gave up her time to visit the school to read her book **"A Pain in my Chest".** A Pain in my Chest is a beautiful picture book which explores the world of anxiety from the perspective of a child. The book takes readers on a journey towards healing, friendship and selfacceptance. The children thoroughly enjoyed the

reading and were very excited to meet Aine. **Kidsview** contributions allow the children to purposefully write and express their thoughts, views and experiences. Second Class children chose a topic – they draft and rewrite – they may even interview other children in order to complete their contribution! This has many benefits increasing confidence, self-esteem and self-belief. The school has completed its involvement with **Junior**

This action is in response to the many reports publishing the negative affects of certain types of mobile phone use, social media use and internet content on our young children. We at HFJNS strongly encourage parents to consider delaying the purchase of smartphones for their children until they complete primary school. Following this launch, we are pleased with the anonymous responses equating now to an uptake of 88.4% of children in our school. Creative Schools 2024

Earlier this year the school applied to ealaíon take part in an art initiative called Creative Schools. It was one of only approximately 130 schools chosen to partake. The Creative Schools initiative supports schools in putting the arts and creativity at the heart of children's and young people's lives. Creative Schools is part of the Creative Ireland Programme and it's led by representatives from the Arts Council, the Education Department and the Department of Culture, Heritage & the Gaeltacht. This year we had artists visit the school to undertake workshops on tie-dyeing and clay modelling with all the children in First and Second classes. In the new school year, this initiative will be expanded to class levels from Junior Infants to second class.
