Junior Achievement



We were delighted to take part in the Junior Achievement programme again this term. Through this programme, volunteers from the workplace support classroom learning while sharing their real-life experiences with students. Ms. McManus', Mr. Murphy's and Ms. Fadden's classes participated in ByteSize, a five-session programme developed by Microsoft Dream Space. The programme helps children develop computational thinking and problem-solving skills through fun, hands-on activities. Students also learn that making mistakes is an important part of learning. By finding and fixing "bugs," they build confidence, resilience, and perseverance. The feedback from the children has been extremely positive and we look forward to working with Junior Achievement again next year. Active Week 2026



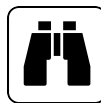

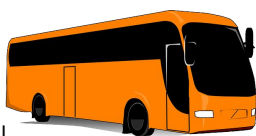
