Literacy	<ul> <li>Reading:</li> <li>Wonderland readers are available at <u>http://wonderland.cjfallon.ie</u></li> <li>Click on Stage 2 and scroll across to 'A Surprise for Feena'.</li> <li>Continue reading from where your child's class left off, reading 2-3 pages per day.</li> </ul>
	<b>Novel Work</b> Children to pick a novel of their own choosing to read over the next few weeks. We will be assigning different pieces of work to be completed based on this novel as the weeks progress.
	<ul> <li>This week's tasks:</li> <li>Look at the front cover of the book and read the blurb. Write a prediction (5 – 6 sentences) for what you think the book might be about based on the cover and the blurb.</li> <li>Draw a picture of the main character of the book, based on what you have read so far.</li> </ul>
	Creative Writing
	<b>REMEMBER:</b> Brainstorm ideas before you start writing!
	<ul> <li>Write a story based on the idea 'The Easter Bunny Who Lost His/Her Eggs'. (This can be worked on over the next 2 weeks or so).</li> <li>Remember that good stories have a beginning, middle and end.</li> <li>In the beginning, we meet characters and learn where the story takes place (the setting)</li> <li>In the middle, the main character encounters a problem (e.g. the bunny losing their eggs).</li> <li>At the end, the problem is solved (e.g. how does the bunny find his eggs again? Who helps?).</li> </ul>
	<b>REMEMBER:</b> Good writers ALWAYS read over their work! Don't forget to use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.
	<ul> <li>Sound of the Week</li> <li>'ti' making the /sh/ sound, e.g. nation, station, etc.</li> </ul>

	Come up with a list of words that contain this sound.
	Practise putting these words into sentences.
	Dictation based on this week's sound.
