## Work List for Second Class March 30<sup>th</sup> to April 3<sup>rd</sup>

<b>Literacy</b>	<p><b>Reading:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Wonderland readers are available at <a href="http://wonderland.cjfallon.ie">http://wonderland.cjfallon.ie</a></li><li>• Click on Stage 2 and scroll across to 'A Surprise for Feena'.</li><li>• Continue reading from where your child's class left off, reading 2-3 pages per day.</li></ul> <p><b>Novel Work</b></p> <p>Children have already picked a novel of their own choosing to read over the next few weeks.</p> <p>This week's tasks:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Write the thoughts in the head of a character: choose a character from the novel and write <u>part of the story</u> from his/her point of view. You will use the word 'I' in the story. For example: "Hi! I am Ms Trunchbull and let me tell you my story."</li><li>• Draw a picture of the front cover of your book but based on the Character that you have chosen side of the story. For example: Ms Trunchbull might rename the book 'Matilda' to 'That Troublesome, Naughty Child!'</li></ul> <p><b>Creative Writing</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Continue on with the title given to you last week.</li><li>• Write a story based on the idea 'The Easter Bunny Who Lost His/Her Eggs'.</li></ul> <p>Also this week as we are coming up to Easter we would like you to write an acrostic poem based on the word Easter. For example 'E is for Eggs'</p> <p><b>Sound of the Week</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 'sion' making the /shun/ sound, e.g. revision, invasion, television etc.</li></ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>➤ Come up with a list of words that contain this sound.</li><li>➤ Practise putting these words into sentences.</li><li>➤ Dictation based on this week's sound.</li></ul> <p><b>Grammar</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• This week's grammar topic focuses on 'prepositions'.</li><li>• Preposition is a word that describes where a noun is in relation to another noun. For example 'Inky left her mouse-hole and went <u>under</u> the fence'</li><li>• There are plenty of helpful videos on <a href="http://www.youtube.com">www.youtube.com</a></li><li>• Scratch Garden have a fun song to explain the topic <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xyMrLQ4ZI-4">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xyMrLQ4ZI-4</a></li><li>• There are some fun games based on 'prepositions' Write all of the items in your bedroom that are 'under' For example, 'My book is under my teddy'</li></ul>
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	<p><b>Comprehension</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ‘My Read at Home 2’ book available at <a href="https://my.cifallon.ie/login">https://my.cifallon.ie/login</a></li> <li>• Click on ‘Student Resources’ and filter across.</li> </ul> <p>This week’s comprehension: ‘Easter Island’ pg. 92</p> <p>Remind children to read the questions before they read the comprehension so that they have an idea of what to look out for when reading.</p>
<p><b>Maths</b></p>	<p>Each week, the children will focus on a different mathematical topic or concept. This week’s topic is: <b>weight</b></p> <p>Don’t forget to sign into <a href="http://www.folensonline.ie">www.folensonline.ie</a> for access to Planet Maths book.</p> <p>Some additional activities based on weight:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 10 different objects from their house. They must first estimate then measure the weight of the objects before placing them in order from lightest to heaviest.</li> <li>• The children can estimate then measure how many pencils, crayons, teddies etc. weigh the same as <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> kg, <math>\frac{1}{2}</math> kg and 1kg.</li> <li>• Packaging: Look at packaging. Make a list of the weights on packages and then group products with similar weights.</li> <li>• Find examples of different items that weigh less than 1kg, weigh 1kg and more than 1kg in the house. Try find ten items in each category</li> <li>• Write a recipe for Easter Chocolate Corn Flake Cakes using grams. <p><b>SPHE</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Call grandparents for a chat. Compose twenty questions to ask them. For example: ‘how are you?’ ‘Have you taken up a new hobby?’ Can include questions to support SESE topic of Easter around the world and traditions. For example ‘Has the celebration of Easter changed much since you were younger?’</li> <li>• Help out with jobs around the house while mam and dad are working from home!</li> <li>• Continue to wash your hands!</li> </ul>
<p><b>Arts</b></p>	<p><b>Easter Eggs:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Follow step by step to create your own Easter Picture. We may not be able to get out hunting for Easter eggs this year so let’s make our own!</li> </ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pick an Easter themed video from either ‘Draw So Cute’ or ‘Art for Kids Hub’ and practise drawing and colouring.</li> </ul>
