	habitats

	Phonics – Revise all initial sounds
	 Listen to the songs and stories from Jolly Phonics
	 Word families: make a list of _an, _at, _en and _et words (e.g: pan, man, sat, splat, hen, ten, wet, vet)

	Read the stories of 'Zac the Rat' and 'Peg the Hen'.

	 Make an alphabet at home – Write each letter of the alphabet on a piece of paper. Ask your child to organise the letters into the order of the alphabet.
	Remove some letters and ask your child which letter is missing.
	Writing – letter formation u and y. Please focus on lower case letters only.
	 Always encourage correct pencil grip –tripod grip – froggy legs and give him a
	log.
	• Put some paint or shaving foam into a sealed zip lock bag - Using a cotton
	bud, the children can write their letters into the paint!
	• When beginning these letters always start at the top.
	• When forming letters do not take the pencil off the page

	• 4: down and over and down some more, that's the way we make a 4
	• 5: down and around and a hat on high, that's the way we make a 5
	• 0: around and round and round we go, when we get home we have a 0!
