Literacy

Oral Language

- ➤ Being active and exercising active, exercising, moving, breath, energy, run, jog, skip, walk, heart rate.
- May, calendar, days of the week, months of the year.

Phonics – Revise all initial sounds

- Listen to the songs and stories from Jolly Phonics

Writing

- letter formation of k. Please focus on the lower-case letter only.

- Always encourage correct pencil grip –tripod grip froggy legs and give him a log.
- When beginning these letters always start at the top.
- ➤ When forming letters **do not** take the pencil off the page (only to cross the 't, dot the 'i' and for the letter k.
- Letters we have covered so far: c, o, a, g, d, q, e, l, i, n, h, r, m, u, y.

Reading

- Oxford Owl Reading test This short test helps gauge which reading level your child is suited to https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/reading/reading-schemes-oxford-levels/which-reading-level-stage
- ➤ Once the test is complete, it will give a list of suitable eBooks your child can read. You can log into the website and access the books that best suits your child's level.
- ➤ Revise Jolly Phonics Red Tricky Words List I, he, me, she, be, we, the, of, to, was, do. These are sight words which can't be sounded out. Practice identifying, reading and memorising these words with your child.
- Sample Activity: Place the words on the table (gradually build up to all 11 words), say a word and your child finds it.

Counting

- Make counting more fun by counting and hopping, action counting, counting and throwing and skipping.
- Try using some actions such as hands on the hip, hop on one foot, clap your hands, cross your arms, heads in the air and hands on your head.
- Continue counting forward 1-30 and backwards 30-1 while using these actions.
- Begin at a random number for example 20. Count on 2 and backwards 2.
