Literacy	<p>Reading:</p> <p>‘Dance Shoes for GG’ and ‘The Camper Van Fun’ is available online on http://wonderland.cjfallon.ie. Click ‘Stage 2’ and scroll across. Activities to support both readers can be found on the ‘Interactives’ menu in Stage 2. Pay particular attention to the direction of letters, making tall letters tall and making sure letters with tails e.g. g, j, p, q, y, sit on the line with the tail underneath.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• News for the week.
Maths	<p>You can sign up for free access to the children’s Maths book (Planet Maths) by going to www.folensonline.ie and following the steps below:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Click ‘Register’ and select ‘Teacher’.2. Fill in a username, email and password.3. For Roll Number use the code: Prim20. <p>Tables: Continue with next set of subtraction tables.</p> <p>Mental Maths:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Counting in 2s, Counting in 5s, Counting in 10s, forwards and backwards. Start on a number and count on 10.• Start on a number and count on 5 numbers i.e. I am starting on 12 and counting on 5 numbers 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17.

	<p>Try different variations i.e. start on a number and count back 5 numbers.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write a number on a piece of paper, encourage your child to guess the number. Give hints as to what the number could be i.e. this is a double-digit number, there is a straight line in this number, double six is this number (number is 12). Alternatively write a number on a piece of paper, show your child a small corner of the number and encourage your child to guess the number. <p>Word problems:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • David has 13 oranges. His Dad gives him 5 more. How many oranges does he have? • Sarah bought 8 sweets, but she ate 3 sweets on the way home. How many does she have left? • Jack had 7 footballs. His friend Paul gave him 13 more. How many does he have altogether? • This shape has 3 points and 3 sides. What shape is it? • If today is Monday, what day will it be in four days time? • Anna has 6 cookies. How many more does she need to have 10 cookies? • Katie has 9 pencils. How many more does she need to have 9 pencils? • What coins will I need to make 13 cent? • What coins will I need to make 8 cent? • How many tens are in the number 35? • How many units are in the number 27? <p>Number line work: Use your number line to complete these and write them into your copy.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. $5 + \underline{\quad} = 10$ 2. $9 + \underline{\quad} = 15$ 3. $2 + \underline{\quad} = 13$ 4. $\underline{\quad} + 4 = 10$ 5. $10 + \underline{\quad} = 17$ 6. $\underline{\quad} + 8 = 12$ 7. $4 + \underline{\quad} = 12$ 8. $1 + \underline{\quad} = 9$

Talk about the view of the classroom and answer the questions.
