Literacy	Reading
	<ul> <li>Practice the new sight words for the next reader '<u>The Beach House'</u>. Teacher will email a power point with the next 20 new words to practice.</li> <li><u>Tricky words:</u> Continue working on the Green set: why, where, who, which, any, many, more, before, other, were, because, want</li> <li>Story Time: Libraries Ireland have a lovely resource where you can join a story time session by the author from a particular library, have a look if you want: <a href="https://www.librariesireland.ie/services/right-to-read/spring-into-storytime">https://www.librariesireland.ie/services/right-to-read/spring-into-storytime</a></li> <li>Oxford Owl offer a free eBook library for 3 - 11 year olds. 	Writing:
	<ul> <li>Continue writing My news/ My diary (Once a week)</li> <li>Independent writing: My House or 'What Can You See At Home?'</li> <li>Children can write the sentences in their copy and draw a picture to match. e.g. My house is white. It has 3 windows at the front. The kitchen is downstairs. Etc.</li> </ul>
	Teachers will email a picture prompt to you.
	<ul> <li>Reminders: Capital letters and full stops. Correct letter formation. Tripod pencil grip.</li> <li>Letter formation: Ss and Xx. Children can copy your writing in their copy.</li> </ul>
	Phonics:
	<ul> <li>Continue to revise all letter names, sounds and digraphs (ai, oa, ie, ee, or, ng, oo, ch, sh, th, qu, ou, oi, ue, er, ar)</li> <li>Dictation based on digraphs – focus on th and th this week:</li> <li>Sample of words to dictate based on ' th th '- this, that, thick, thin, father, mother, feather, brother. Sample of sentences to dictate based on 'th / th': I have a sore throat. I see the thorn. The boy thinks he hears thunder. That thick bread is nice. The thrush can sing. Three green trees.</li> <li>Jolly Phonics Rule: magic 'e' makes a vowel say its name.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Focus on o – followed by magic 'e' makes the short vowel change to the long vowel.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Look at words with short o and see what happens when you add magic 'e'</li> <li>pop – pope, rob – robe, con – cone, cod – code, hop – hope, glob – globe, not</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>note</li> <li>Write a list of these words. Look for words with this rule in stories. Dictate some of the words for children to write.</li> </ul>
	• Sounds like Phonics Activity Book B- <a href="https://slp.cjfallon.ie/">https://slp.cjfallon.ie/</a> Unit 3 links well to this week's work. When you click on that link, click into Activity Book B, then Unit 3, then Long Vowels, then Long O.

	<ul> <li>Counting forwards to 100 in 1s and 10s and 5s</li> </ul>
	Counting backwards from 40 to 1
	<ul> <li>Counting forwards in 2s to 50 (odd numbers/even numbers)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Revising number formation (0-10)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Skip counting forwards/backwards on a number line e.g. Start on 5 and go on 4 jumps. Start on 10 and go back 4 jumps etc.</li> </ul>
	• Simple Word Problem Practice- Ella has 20c. What can she buy in the shop if
	sweets are 2c, pencils are 5c, copies are 10c? How many copies can she buy?
