	for child. Slight tilt page up to the right for right-handed children and
	downward tilt to left for left-handed child.
	Letter p video: Using the handwriting copy, start writing at the dot.
	From the dot, bring the pencil down past the bottom line, then
	straight back up to the dot again and then bring the pencil out to the
	right and curve around.

	Letter z video: Using the handwriting copy, start writing at the dot.
	Write towards the right, then down to the line and across to the
	right again.
	When forming letters please do not take the pencil off the page.
	Only to cross the 't' and 'f', dot the 'i', for the letter 'k' and 'x'

	marker. Take turns hitting the balloon back and forth with your
	child. When it reaches you, model for your child looking at the
	closest sight word and reading it. Then toss the balloon back to your
	child and have them catch it. They should read the sight word
	closest to them.

	Then and Now (Small World Book pg. 43):
